

A Life of Worship

Study Questions for Week #4

I Corinthians 10:23-33

We have looked at various scriptures in relation to the theme of worship. From the Garden of Eden to the future glory of the new heavens and the new earth, we have seen that there is a purpose to our worship – the exaltation of Jesus Christ.

So, how does this relate to our daily lives? Everything in our lives should be done for the glory of God, but what does that look like in practice? As we have seen in our study, we remember that everything in our lives is an opportunity to exalt Christ, which leads to worship.

Prayerfully consider what you can do with your life to offer Him worship ... and then follow through with action. An obedient life is a life of worship.

Read I Corinthians 10:23-33

The context of this passage is Christian liberty. While Christians have been given freedom in certain “gray areas,” we are to do all things for the glory of God. How does this affect our lives as it relates to our worship? (*While everything is permissible, not everything is beneficial.*)

Read verse 24. How might this command change the decisions we make in our daily lives? Do you stop and consider this verse when making choices regarding what to do and how to act?

Write down a modern-day example of what Paul was addressing to the Corinthian church. How would verse 24 help you address this issue in a godly manner?

How might your life of worship affect the body of Christ? Have you ever considered how you worship – in terms of obedient living, not musical worship – affects the church?

Read verses 31-33. Write down three practical things you can do to offer pleasing worship that brings glory to God (*any act, thought or word*). Commit to doing these three things this next week.

What is one area of your life that you have not viewed as worship, but after considering this text you now realize that you should view it this way?

After completing this study, has God shown you any area of your life that is giving evidence of the Spirit working in your worship? Be encouraged that as we grow in our faith, our worship becomes sweeter because we know Him more.
