

Psalm 66 – Praising God for His Mighty Acts

Lesson 2 Study Questions – Psalm 66:5-7

1. In Psalm 66:5, we read, “Come and see the works of God; He is awesome in His doing toward the sons of men.” Look at the word “awesome.” The word is rendered “terrible” in some Bible versions. II Corinthians 2:15-16 shows how the Gospel produces different effects – the aroma of death leading to death for those who are perishing and the aroma of life leading to life among those who are being saved.

a. Re-read the story of the parting of the Red Sea in Exodus 14:15-22. Have you ever had a “Red Sea” experience, where God made a path for you to walk on “dry land,” so to speak?

b. Have you ever seen this in someone else’s life?

c. How might the sharing of an experience like that affect someone who hears it?

2. Read one or more of the following Psalms – Psalm 19, 24, 33, 78, 104, 105, 111, 145.

a. Write down the mighty acts of God that the Psalmist mentions.

b. What do these acts tell you about God?

c. What should your response be to these acts of God?

3. Read in New Morning Mercies.

a. Pick one devotion out of the last week that speaks to your heart.

b. What, if anything, about this devotion spoke to you? Is there something you might need to change as a response to this devotion?

c. Share this devotion with someone – either as an encouragement to them, or to ask them to pray for you concerning the subject matter of the devotion.

d. Read the Scripture at the bottom of the devotion. Why did Tripp direct you to that particular Scripture?
